

Village of Randolph Water Utility Rate Case Update

Application Submitted

On **July 28, 2026**, the Village of Randolph Municipal Water Utility submitted a Conventional Rate Case (CRC) application to the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSC) requesting an adjustment to water rates.

Why a Rate Adjustment?



The rate adjustment is needed to:

- Keep pace with increasing operating costs
- Support major water system improvements planned between 2026 and 2029, including the Well Rehabilitation Project
- Generate enough revenue to make future debt payments
- Meet financial requirements to qualify for Safe Drinking Water Fund loans through the DNR, which offer significantly lower interest rates than traditional borrowing (for communities that meet eligibility requirements).

What Could This Mean for Your Water Bill?

Estimated increase to the **water portion of the monthly** utility bill for an average residential customer using 3,250 gallons per month



These figures are estimates only. The PSC will review the Village's application and determine the final rates using its required rate-setting process.

What Happens Next?



PSC Review

Over the coming months, the PSC will review the application.



Public Comment & Hearing

A public comment period and public hearing are anticipated approximately 4 months after the July 28 filing date.



Formal Notice

Once hearing information is available, customers will receive a more formal notice with details about the proposed rates, public comment opportunities, and the PSC public hearing.



Expected Effective Date

The Village anticipates that any PSC-approved water rate changes would take effect during the first quarter of 2027.
